The following agreement is shared with and signed by the student taking part in the mobility, the family and the school with the aim of:

- Agreeing on a personalized learning path, to which all parties commit to, aimed at providing value to the experience abroad when the student will be readmitted in the sending school;
- Clarifying the learning objectives (intercultural, curricular and transversal) related to the study period abroad, and the criteria and methods of assessment;
- Promote a trustworthy and positive relation among parties, based on mutual respect and cooperation, also taking into consideration that mobility is an experience strongly supported and promoted by the European Union;
- Build on the experience abroad of the student and provide visibility to its outcomes, in order for the whole school and the local community to benefit from the mobility of the individual.

# The student commits to:

• Attend regularly, with interest and active participation, the hosting schools.

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- Inform every .... the sending school, through his/her tutor (mentioned above), about the performance in the hosting school, the school subject s/he is following, the projects, workshops s/he is attending, the language learning and other competences acquired (language, digital, social&civic, personal, subjectrelated)
- Send to the sending school a certificate of attendance and if applicable- the assessments provided by the hosting school during the period abroad
- If the recognition of the school study period abroad applies: ask to the hosting school at the end of the study period abroad the documentation useful for this recognition and send it immediately to the sending school.

#### The family commits to:

- Take care of the bureaucratic aspects (subscription to school, communication with schools and sending organisation-if applicable).
- Keep in touch every .... with the tutor to update him/her on how the experience abroad is going.
- Support and monitor the exchange of information between the student abroad, the school and the sending organisation-if applicable.

#### The Headmaster and the Class council commit to:

- Assign a teacher (tutor) as point of reference for the student and the family, during the study period abroad.
- Indicate some few- content areas that the student absolutely need to learn related to subjects of the
  national school curriculum, and that will not be followed by the student during the study period abroad.
- Assess the competences of the student before leaving and indicate what are the competences s/he is expected to develop by the time s/he comes back to his/her class after the study period abroad.
- Agree with the student how he/she will be assessed at the end of the experience abroad, if the school can provide some extra lessons to facilitate the learning of parts of the un-studied subjects while abroad, and how all of this will go in the final evaluation.
- Provide a general and holistic assessment which takes into consideration the learning path the student has done abroad, verifying the student's learning on the content areas which are mandatory for the national curriculum, while at the same time acknowledging the value of the intercultural and transversal competences the student has developed. The mobility experience should feature on the document presenting the student for the final exam to accomplish the upper secondary school diploma.
- Take care of providing visibility and showing the value of the mobility experience in the student's class, by organising activities of dissemination.
- Provide formal recognition of the mobility experience (eg credits/school grades)
